



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LESSON SUMMARY

ACTIVITY

Last Day - On the last day of this activity, draw a picture of your seedling on the student participation form. Tell us what you learned about caring for God's creation during this activity. How could you share this information with your family, or the community? Write a prayer, poem or reflection about how you felt during this activity.
